



## Revolution

LUKE 10:1-16 | MARCH 14 & 15, 2015

Last week Pastor Mike brought special attention to the topic of ambition while encouraging us to consider the focus of our ambition. Syler Thomas builds on that talk in the Revolution series and brings further clarity. The goal as “revolutionaries” is not simply ambition - but ambition that is aligned with mission. What is God’s mission and how has he gifted you and invited you to participate in His Kingdom work?

### WITH THE GROUP



#### LEARNING | BEGINNING TO CONNECT WITH THE TOPIC

Describe a mission trip you have taken, a service project you have done or another time that you were able to positively impact a stranger’s life through lovingkindness? How did serving a stranger impact you?



#### LEARNING | GETTING CLEAR ON WHAT WAS TAUGHT

Review Luke 10:13-15. What is the meaning of Jesus’ words in these verses? Why is he referencing the cities of Chorazin and Bethsaida or Tyre and Sidon? Are there implications to be drawn for our lives?

What did Syler mean when he said “we are either the mission field or the mission force?” Which description fits you best?



#### LOVING | GROWING OUR HEART FOR A LOVING GOD

What parts of the sermon most encouraged you, challenged you or helped you understand God in a new way?

Can you think of some positive reasons that God might call us to challenging missions? How do you feel about comfort zones, challenging circumstances and perseverance?



#### LIVING | STARTING TO LIVE LIKE JESUS DAILY

Do you ever find yourself “outsourcing” the mission God has given you? Are you avoiding anything you know you should put into practice? Are you hoping someone else will do your mission instead of you?

In Luke 10 Jesus sent the 70 out in pairs of two. From this Syler notes “mission is to be done in community.” What could you pursue in the next week that your small group could help you complete (either directly or through accountability)?

#### DIGGING DEEPER

Read the book of Jonah and take note of the mission. What lessons can you draw from your reading about God’s tasks for us, God’s love for others and God’s involvement in our mission?

#### GRADUATE LEVEL

From scripture - write some paragraphs or bullets on how a person can discover their mission and be guided by God. How can a person determine both the gifts they’ve been given and the work that is desired. Is this how you have put God’s mission into practice in your own life?
