## BIBLE EXPLORATION

**MOST PEOPLE DO NOT SPEND THEIR DAY LAUGHING. MANY ARE STRESSED OR DEPRESSED, HARRIED AND FRUSTRATED.**

**Read out loud -Habakkuk 1:1-13**

**Notes about the reading**

*A man named Habakkuk lived close to 3,000 years ago.*

He is one of the twelve minor prophets. He lived during the final decade of Israel's southern kingdom – just before her defeat and exile.

It was a time of idolatry, injustice and suffering. It was also a time where Habakkuk saw the rising threat of Babylon.

Unlike other prophets, Habakkuk doesn't accuse Israel of doing things wrong.

*This is a unique book. Instead of speaking to the people, Habakkuk speaks to God*

He calls for God to act and take care of Israel.

God's response is not what he expected

He continues to appeal to God to act.

### Questions

What accusations is Habakkuk making to God within his questions in verses 2-4?

How would you answer his questions in verse 3?

Verse 5 is God's first response, and he appears to be getting ready to help. How do you feel about his reaction in verse 6?

What do we learn about God in his response to Habakkuk?

Habakkuk is persistent in his appeal to God. What can we learn about how we can talk to God?
