WORSHIP

Read Psalm 148 aloud. Take a moment to reflect on God's Word and center in Him.

FELLOWSHIP

What is the most beautiful place you have ever seen? How did you respond to its beauty?

DISCUSSION

1. Talk about different understandings of heaven.

-How have you seen heaven depicted in our culture?

-What do you expect heaven will be like?

-Why is thinking about heaven helpful for our life today?

2. Read Revelation 4:1-5.

-What do you notice about heaven?

-How do the cultural and personal expectations we discussed compare with the biblical picture of heaven in this passage (and throughout the book of Revelation, if you're familiar with it)?

3. Read Revelation 4:6-11.

-What do you notice about the creatures' and elders' worship of God (vv. 8,11)?

-What does this passage teach us about worship and about God?

-How does the worship you see here compare with your engagement in worship services at church?

4. What about God moves you to worship?

5. Pastor Mike argued that we were designed for worship, so everyone worships something or someone (e.g., God, sports, nature, celebrity, politics).

-How do you respond to this idea?

-Who or what do you value most? Does who or what you worship need to change?

-How would it look for you to fully worship God, giving Him your ultimate devotion?

-What is one way you can deepen or refocus your worship on God this week?

PRAYER

Ask for prayer requests; try to remember any needs that came up during the fellowship or discussion time. Check in on requests from last week, if you can. Does anyone have a practical need that another group member may be able to help with?

Pray for group, church, and community needs. Spend some time in adoration, taking turns praising God by saying one name, attribute, or work of God.
