Create a will or living trust

Establish advance healthcare directives
Arrange for life insurance
Plan and prepay for funeral arrangements
Write letters or record messages for loved ones
Organize personal belongings and create a distribution plan
Make a list of important contacts (doctors, lawyers, financial advisors)
Settle outstanding debts
Create a list of recurring bills and subscriptions
Make a list of all social media accounts and email addresses
Document final wishes for medical care and end-of-life decisions
